In order to get to Segovia, you will have two options: high speed train (28 minutes, 12.90€/trip or 20.60€ roundtrip) or bus (1hr 10min, 8.70€/trip).

If you plan on taking the train, you will need to get to the Madrid-Chamartín train station in the north of the city. You will have three options to get there from the Airport:

- 1) If you arrive at Terminal 4, the best option is to take the Cercanías Train C1. This train has a frequency of about every 30 minutes, costs approximately 2.55€, and will get you to the Chamartín train station in approximately 11 minutes. There is an automatic machine where you are able to buy your ticket, and someone will be there in case you need help. Take the train until you arrive at the Chamartín train station. Note: DO NOT throw away the little ticket they give you, as you will need it to leave the Cercanías area.
- 2) If you arrive at Terminal 1 or 2, then you can take the Metro (5€; 30 minutes). You will need to find your way to the Metro station (not too difficult, you just have to follow the signs), and purchase your Metro ticket at one of the machines.
- There is only one line to take from the Airport, which is LINE 8 (Pink), and you will need to take the Metro that goes in the direction of NUEVOS MINISTERIOS.
- You will be on this Metro until the very end of the line (Nuevos Ministerios), and here you will have to follow the signs to get to LINE 10 (Dark Blue).
- You will have to take the Metro that goes in the direction of HOSPITAL INFANTA SOFIA. You will be on this Metro until you arrive at Chamartín (4 stops), and it should only take about 10 15 minutes.
- Once you get off this Metro, you will have to follow the signs that lead you up to the train station. Note: you will have to go outside in order to go up to the train station.

OR

3) Take a Taxi (30€ flat rate; 15 minutes). This is definitely the easiest way to get to Chamartín, as you don't have to worry about finding your way around the Metro or the Cercanías. However, this ease comes with a much higher price.

If you plan on taking the bus to get to Segovia, then you will need to make your way over to Moncloa. You will have the same three options as before, but with some slight changes:

- 1) If you arrive at Terminal 4, please take the free bus (blue and green) until terminal 1.
- 2) If you arrive at Terminal 1 or 2, then you can take the Metro (5€; 45 minutes). You will need to find your way to the Metro station (not too difficult, you just have to follow the signs), and purchase your Metro ticket at one of the machines. You will be on LINE 8 until the very end of the line (Nuevos Ministerios), and here you will have to follow the signs to get to LINE 6 (light grey) until MONCLOA. It will take approximately 45 minutes.

3) Taxi. Please note that a taxi will take about 10 minutes longer, and the price could potentially increase (no more than 5 − 7 €), though I unfortunately do not have any information regarding this fare as the new fare system is quite recent, and I haven't taken a taxi to MONCLOA since the new system became operative.

Please note that I strongly recommend you take the high speed train, as it is much quicker, and only slightly more expensive than the bus.

Once you are in Segovia, you will be at the train station just a bit outside of the city. Here, you will also have two options for arriving to IE: bus nº11 (1,15€, 20 min in bus and 10 min walking) and taxi (14€, 10-15min). Please let me know which option you wish to take, as I will need to give you instructions on how to walk here after you have gotten off the bus if you prefer this option.

If you decide to take the train to Segovia, you should definitely purchase your tickets online (availability will be scarce if you purchase at the station). In order to purchase your train tickets, you should visit renfe.com.

If you decide to take the bus, you can purchase the tickets right there at the bus station. You will need to go to the 1st floor, and look for the SEPULVEDANA Office, as this is where you will need to purchase the ticket. Please only purchase a ONE – WAY ticket, as a return ticket is only valid for the same day. Please note that buses leave every half hour, but be careful, some buses take over 2 hours to arrive due to the fact that they stop in all the small villages along the way.
