

The School of Economics and Business Administration at Friedrich Schiller University of Jena seeks to fill the following position for the fall semester 2011/2012 (successor to Prof. Dr. K.-D. Koschmieder):

Professor (W3) in General Business Studies/Taxation and Auditing

Candidates are expected to have first-rate publications in relevant business journals and to demonstrate a clear focus on taxation or auditing, either with an economic-theoretical or an empirical orientation. Ideally, they should be able to document their work with peer-reviewed research projects funded by third-party sponsors.

The professor will represent the field of Taxation and Auditing in teaching at the School of Economics and Business Administration.

The successful candidate is expected to collaborate in the School's primary areas of research. Further, the candidate is expected to coordinate her/his teaching program with the collaborating professors in the "Accounting, Taxation and Capital Markets" area of the School and advance the existing cooperation with the School of Law.

To further internationalize the faculty's research and teaching profile, the language of instruction should be English at least for some courses. The teaching workload is 9 hours per week and per semester.

Requirements for this position include a doctoral degree and a postdoctoral lecture qualification or equivalent scientific achievements as well as pedagogical aptitude.

The School of Economics and Business Administration seeks to increase the number of women among the members of its academic staff and thus welcomes applications submitted by qualified female academics.

Physically challenged applicants with equal qualifications and experience will be given preferential treatment over other applicants.

If this is the candidate's first appointment, the employment will begin on a term-limited basis. Exceptions are possible. Once initial contracts are extended, reapplication is not necessary.
