Edward Maydew's teaching and research interests include, among other things, tax strategy, financial accounting, corporate taxation, economic effects of taxation and the role of accounting information in valuation. Dr. Maydew is the David E. Hoffman Distinguished Professor of Accounting, University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill (USA). He also serves as director of research for the UNC Tax Center. He has also been on the faculty of the University of Chicago and a visiting professor at Cornell University.

He has received awards of excellence for his teaching and research. He is coauthor of *Taxes and Business Strategy: A Planning Approach* with Nobel Prize winning economist Myron Scholes and accounting professors Mark Wolfson, Merle Erickson and Terry Shevlin. He has published in the top academic journals in his field, including *The Accounting Review*, *Journal of Accounting and Economics*, *Journal of Accounting Research*, *Journal of Finance*, *Journal of Public Economics*, *National Tax Journal*, and *Journal of the American Taxation Association*. He currently serves on the editorial boards of *The Accounting Review*, *Journal of Accounting and Economics*, *Journal of Accounting Research*, and *Review of Accounting Studies*.

Dr. Maydew consults with prominent law firms and corporations on a variety of complex accounting and tax matters. Prior to earning his PhD, he was employed by a predecessor of PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP in its Chicago office. He received a PhD from the University of Iowa and a BBA from Iowa State University.
